Stakeholder Comments

- Strong engagement from the stakeholder community:
 - Received 18 sets of comments from a wide variety of sectors
 - Comments are posted publicly on the RA webpage
- Work Group is digesting comments and determining how best to incorporate feedback into next phase of the initial stakeholder process
- Comments are helping structure the Work Group workplan in the following areas:
 - Timing for development of different areas of the proposal- what elements are most pressing for early development and what elements can wait until later in the design process
 - Creating additional subgroups within the Work Group based on issues stakeholders highlighted
 - Shaping summer/fall workshop topics

Stakeholder Comments

High level themes from comments:

- Support for a longer timeline- using the summer/fall for additional workshops and design with stakeholders, with an Initial Draft Proposal release in the late fall
- Areas identified for focus ahead of an Initial Draft Proposal:
 - Governance
 - Role of the BOSR and Public Power
 - Role and composition of the Technical Oversight Committee
 - Stakeholder process and voting
 - Transmission requirement and deliverability
 - Compliance incentives and penalties
 - Various technical aspects- modeling, accreditation, load forecasting

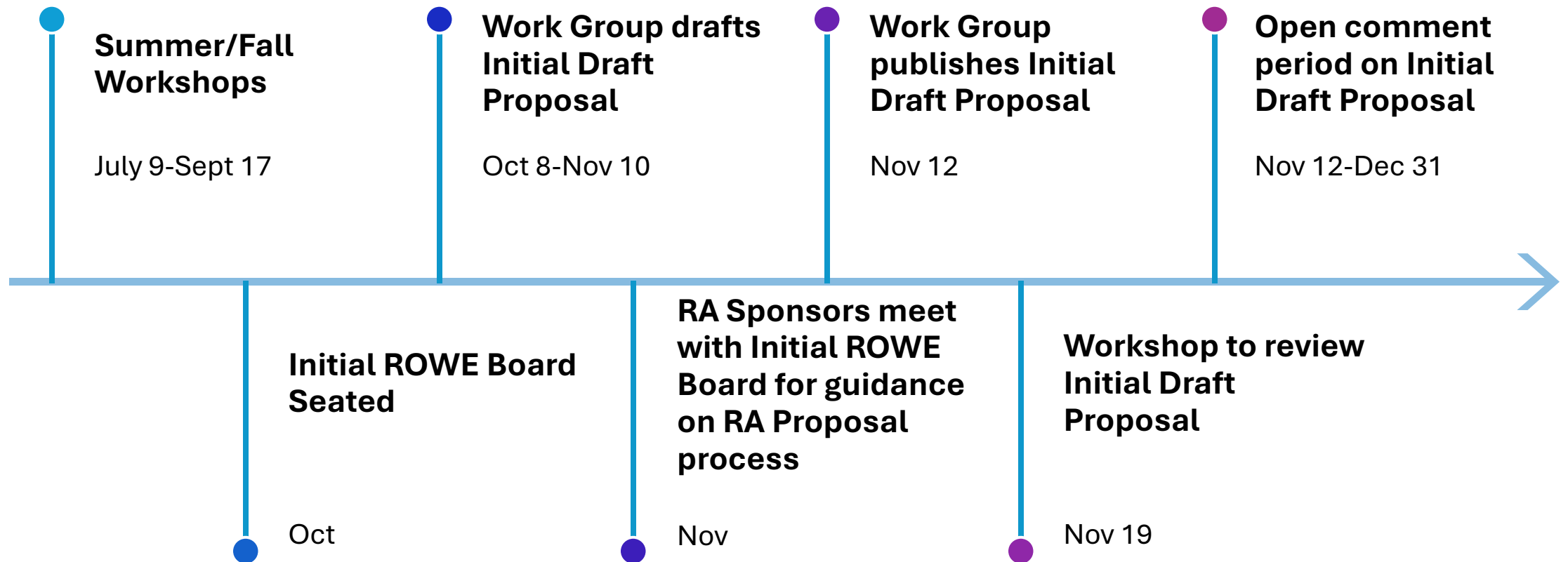
Stakeholder Comments

High level themes from comments:

- Articulate and continue to develop the Program's interoperability/parity/harmonization with other RA programs
- Data and information availability
 - Balancing need for confidentiality with ability to assess Program performance
- Alignment of Initial Stakeholder Process and Program with ROWE framework; timeline for transitioning stakeholder process to ROWE

Timeline: 2026

To allow for more collaboration with the goal of developing an Initial Proposal with broad support, the following schedule is proposed:



Timeline: 2027

Dates are approximate; feedback from Initial ROWE Board may result in changes to timeline



Summer/Fall Workshops

- In response to stakeholder feedback, summer/fall workshop schedule was designed to include breaks and go at a more moderate pace compared to the spring workshops
- 7 workshops to be held July-September
- 3 comment periods open for two weeks following the close of each month's workshops:
 - Comments for July workshops due August 6
 - Comments for August workshops due September 3
 - Comments for September workshops due October 8
- Comment periods may not allow for all feedback to be incorporated into all subsequent workshops, but comments will help shape ongoing conversations around design development and be an input for drafting the Initial Draft Proposal
- Additional workshop topics may be added to scheduled workshops based on how conversations progress; asking for stakeholder flexibility and acknowledging fluidity of the process

- Workshop #13, September 17: Updates on Governance, Technical Design, Transmission, Compliance, and Data
